- **Distinguished Member Award** Distinguished Membership may be awarded to members or former members who have made distinguished contributions to institutional research.
- Special Recognition Unsung Hero Award This award recognizes the ongoing contributions of a member of SAIR and the field of institutional research and planning in the broadest sense.

Nominations can be submitted by September 12 directly to Maren Hess (hess@campbell.edu) and should include the following five sections:

- SAIR Award Name: (James Montgomery Outstanding Service Award, Distinguished Member Award, Special Recognition Unsung Hero Award)
- 2. Nominator information: name, current position, company/institutional affiliation, address, phone, and email
- 3. Nominee information: name, current position, company/institutional affiliation, address, phone, and email
- 4. Has this nomination been discussed with the nominee?: (Yes or No)
- 5. Provide a narrative summary of 1,000 words or less. The narrative should evaluate the nominee's accomplishments and a specific identification of the work to be recognized; explain why the nominee is being recommended for this award with regard to the stated purposes of the award; if the nominee has received another SAIR award within the last five years, specifically describe why this nomination is appropriate; if the nominee has received a previous SAIR award, describe why this award nomination does not cover the basis for a previous award; analyze patents if cited, and if the nominee is not the sole author of works, specify the contribution of the nominee.

What is a College Football Game without a Good Tailgate?

Stated differently: What is a SAIR Conference without a Good Pre-Conference Workshop?

Okay, maybe that wasn't the best analogy, but hopefully you are still reading. Pre-conference workshops are excellent opportunities for new professionals and veterans alike. Want to advance your skills and do some meaningful networking? There may be no better way to do it than attending a pre-conference workshop. The workshops are three-hour deep-dives into topics that are important to IR, IE, Assessment and Planning professionals.

This year **SAIR** is offering several pre-conference workshops on October 6th and 7th in Norfolk, Virginia. They say "Virginia is for Lovers" – well we hope you will love the idea of getting more out of your trip by attending one or more workshops. These workshops are being conducted by veteran SAIR and national presenters. Take the opportunity to improve yourself by learning a new skill or reinforcing the ones you have. These are small sessions where you will get a lot of personal attention.

If you are new to SAIR or our profession, you should definitely attend our **Newcomers' Workshop** led by Abby Willcox and Laura Mills. It will be an all-day event on Sunday. I am especially happy that many of our presenters from last year are back presenting again, either on different topics or with revisions to what they have done before. We have returning presenters offering paired, morning-afternoon, workshops on **Tableau** (G. Marc Turner) and **Excel** (Sarah Hough and Barrie Fitzgerald). I am extremely excited and personally honored that one of the icons of our profession, Mary Sapp, is coming out of retirement to carry me as we lead a discussion of **management and leadership best practices** in our professions. I will also be sharing my research on building a **modern data governance structure.**

Will Miller will once again lead two workshops, this time on using focus groups in assessment and a comprehensive bootcamp on predictive analytics. Suzanne Simpson, Jennifer Moore, Ginny Cockerill, and Andrew Garner have returned with a new topic – predicting graduate student success. Other returning presenters are Galiya Tabulda discussing the use of metrics in strategic plan implementation and Brody Yu (along with Sam Shi) who will be teaching you how to do predictive modeling and decision trees using SPSS. We have also guaranteed that SAS will be represented in two sessions. In one, John Berry and Wes Rehm will feature highly graphical statistical modeling and Samantha Bradley will help us figure out student enrollment with Markov Chain Modeling in SAS.

Another current SAIR Board member, Wendy Kallina, will be presenting with Eric Atchison on assessing stu-

dent success for SACSCOC. We will also offer opportunities to take a deep dive on two national surveys. Joseph Roy will be joining us to discuss the AAUP Faculty Compensation Survey and Portal and Tom Eleutario will present the latest on the Delaware Study.

I hope you find something of interest to you in our Pre-conference Workshops (see http://www.louisianau.com/sair18/sair_program_list_workshop.php). I am grateful to our talented presenters and hope you will join them.
