

Professional Development Crisis Fund

At the SAIR SIG during the AIR Forum, the Board announced the establishment of the Professional Development Crisis Fund. While it is the Board's hope that this fund never needs to be used, over the past several years, many SAIR members have been personally impacted by natural disasters. It is an unfortunate fact of life that more members will probably be impacted in the future as well. As SAIR demonstrated in Fall 2005, as an organization and as individual members, we are concerned about our membership and want to help as much as possible.

The purpose of the fund is to provide funds to supplement professional development needs of members who are victims of natural disasters. Also, at their discretion, the Board will use this fund to help provide additional travel grants to members from areas in the Southern region that sustain significant damage. This fund was established by a \$5,000 contribution from SAIR. The goal is that the fund will grow and be maintained by donations from individual SAIR members. Currently the fund has a balance of \$5,103.16. Current SAIR members who are impacted by natural disasters can currently apply for grants up to \$750 from this fund to replace or supplement professional development needs that would otherwise be out of pocket expenses.

Data and Decisions Workshop for Community Colleges Austin, Texas, December 6-8, 2007

Increasingly, college leaders base strategic decisions on data—targeted information about their own institution and up-to-date information about peer institutions when necessary. The ability to access, analyze and convert data into strategic information is critical to institutions operating in today's ever-changing educational climate. With support from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), AIR, AACC and NCCCRP are offering a Workshop on Data for Strategic Decision-Making in Austin, Texas, December 6-8, 2007.

The team-based workshop is intended to develop the capacity of institutional leaders to use data in making decisions, recognizing that many institutions can devote only modest resources to information gathering and analysis.
